Welcome to our Speech and Language Resource Base (SLRB).

My name is Jackie Lynch and I manage the Resource Base.

Our SLRB provides an intensive learning environment for learners with a developmental language disorder (formerly speech and language impairment.)

It is a part-time provision in which teachers and Speech and Language Therapists (SALT) work closely together to provide support for children from across the borough.

We have a Key Stage 1 and a Key Stage 2 class. Children attend for an initial assessment placement for 2 terms. At the end of these 2 terms we hold a review with all involved to discuss their progress and possible continuation at the SLRB

We aim to provide our learners with a toolkit of self help strategies to enable them to transition back to home-school full time

As part of our offer for the children the teachers provide termly outreach support at their home-school. At times, the SALT will visit them in their home school also to further support their language skills

A day in the life of Acorn Class includes:

- Phonics and guided reading
- Maths
- Snack time
- Circle time
- Topic based activities

All of our sessions have an emphasis on developing speech and language skills

"It makes you feel special."

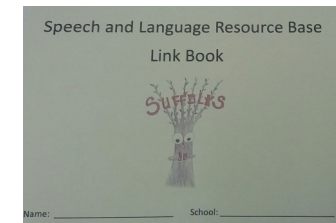
"When you get shy, people help you."

How family can help

- ⇒ Encourage your child to talk about events
- ⇒ Allow them thinking time to respond
- ⇒ Support your child in asking questions to support their learning e.g. Please can I have some help? Please can you say that again? What does that mean?

How school can help

- ⇒ Visit SLRB once the child has settled
- ⇒ Implement shared resources in the classroom
- ⇒ Follow suggestions provided with Speech and Language targets
- ⇒ Share targets and resources with all relevant staff
