

Suffolks Primary School Curriculum Newsletter Year 5 **Summer 2024**

English

In English, we will be continuing with our new scheme 'The Write Stuff'. Our Literacy cycle this term will include a fictional piece of writing based on a video called 'The Present' where the children will be using their imagination to continue the story.

The non-fiction text will centre around David Attenborough - the children will go on to write a biography about him.

In these lessons children will be taught grammatical skills and shown how to stack a sentence. Each lesson will build up and work towards their final piece of writing.



Reading

We will be working on the different elements of skilled reading with a variety of text types as well as learning techniques on answering detailed comprehension questions. We will be practising specific skills such as: summarising; understanding vocabulary; viewpoints; the author's intent; inference and more, in greater detail.

Our text types include non-chronological reports, biographies, newspaper reports, explanations, poems and stories.



Be Web Wise!

Maths

Children will continue their work on fractions: multiplying and dividing fractions and finding equivalences between fractions, decimals and percentages.



Decimals work will continue with: understanding hundredths and thousandths; multiplying decimals;

rounding decimals. This leads on to work with percentages by: understanding percentages and finding percentages of amounts.

We then move on to geometry. Their

work on angles will include: identifying, comparing, measuring, drawing and calculating angles. They will explore properties of 2D and 3D shapes as well as plot, translate and reflect these shapes in all four quadrants.

The children will then work on





measurement with a large focus on converting units of measure of time, mass, length, capacity and volume.

Science
